David J. Wensinger

David Jude Wensinger began playing golf at the age of 8 and by his fifteenth birthday had finished third in the Ohio State Junior Tournament. In 1978 he won the Ohio Insurance Youth Classic, winning a trip to Chicago to play with Fuzzy Zoeller, finishing 30th in a field of 200.

During his junior and senior high school years, David led his team to two state runner-up finishes. Winners of the Marion Country Club Championship in 1979 and 1981, David also captured the title in the Heart of Ohio Championship in 1980, finishing as runner-up in a playoff in 1981.

David was a simple and uncomplicated young man. A success with people that more than rivaled his success with golf, his greatest joy was his family and friends. He had no quarrel with life and he left with the same dignity as he lived...thinking of and helping others.

Dr. Jerome A. Wensinger, following his son's demise, aspired to begin a junior golf program to help give junior golfers opportunities thru the game of golf and to acquire scholarships toward college education; hence the beginning of HOJGA in 1987. The Family wishes to continue the commemoration of David through the David J. Wensinger Player of the Year Scholarship. HOJGA is very grateful for the honor to memorialize David through its scholarship program for youth.

Dress Code

Junior members may dress in casual sportswear: however, no frayed or holey jeans or tops are allowed. Sleeved shirts only must be worn, and shirts must remain on during events. Soft spike golf shoes or tennis shoes only.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Perhaps the most important and lasting lesson taught by participation in Heart of Ohio Junior Golf Association events is the development of a sense of sportsmanship, an appreciation of fair and honest competition, and an attitude of courtesy and respect for fellow players, tournament officials, club members and spectators. In this spirit, the Heart of Ohio Junior Golf Association expects participants in its events to observe all rules set forth in this Code of Conduct. **Failure to observe any of these rules** could result in disqualification from the present or future events and/or any other sanctions deemed appropriate by the Heart of Ohio Junior Golf Association.

- 1. <u>Arrive at tournament location and check in at Registration 1/2 hour before tee time and be near the tee ten</u> minutes before your tee time.
- Conduct yourselves at all times like a true sportsman, and do not engage in un-sportsman like conduct. Acts of un-sportsman like conduct include, but are not limited to the following examples: Throwing clubs; Swearing; Damaging greens; Failing to rake traps; Discarding refuse in any way other than in proper containers.
- 3. You must play quickly enough to keep up with the group ahead of you, and you should move along as rapidly as possible. You will be penalized for undue delay (USGA Rule No. 37-7).
- 4. Each player must play his own game with his own skills and knowledge, and may not give or receive advice. <u>PARENTS AND FRIENDS PLEASE NOTE:</u> Conversation with a player will be deemed to be the giving of advice to that player, and could result in the disqualification of that player and/or the imposition of other penalties. In order to avoid infractions of this rule and to aid in promoting a climate of fair competition in all HOJGA events, it is strongly recommended that you stay at least one-half hole in front of or behind the player whom you are following. **If parents/guests do not abide by this rule, HOJGA will be forced to allow junior golfers only on tournament course.**
- 5. Show the patience and fortitude to complete even the worst round and report your score and do not pick up or fail to turn in your scorecard. Unauthorized "pick ups" will automatically suspend you from the next scheduled event. Your Committee may authorize a "pick up" at any time for appropriate reasons.
- 6. Make certain that only one player is on the tee at one time.
- 7. In order to preserve the tees, do not put your golf bag on them or take unnecessary practice swings on them. Similarly, protect the greens by making sure that when you drop golf bags or flag sticks, both are off the green. Be sure to repair your ball marks on the green. Replace your divots on the fairway.
- 8. Develop the habit of confidence in your swing and eliminate the necessity of repeated practice swings. Remember that repeated practice swings become a bad habit!

ANNUAL AWARDS

Scholarships will be awarded based on the amount of contributions received to support these awards. Awards will be presented to participants in three different age categories: 13-15, 16-18, and 13-18 Girls, using age as of September 1 as the qualifier for determining the players age grouping.

OVERALL POINTS SCHOLARSHIPS & TROPHIES

Each year the Heart of Ohio Junior Golf Association sponsors an Awards Event, at which time, the Junior Golfers who finish first and second in the overall points in the 16-18 age bracket will receive The David J. Wensinger Player of the Year \$2000 Scholarship, and Ross Carley Memorial Player of the Year 1st Runnerup \$1700 Scholarship award respectively; including \$1,000 scholarship, \$750, and six other \$500 scholarships. The 13-15 Division Player of Year will receive The Steve Mills Memorial \$1000, and 1st Runnerup the HOJGA \$750 Scholarships. The 13-15 and 16-18 Girls Division Player of the Year will receive The Amy Wensinger Roberts \$1000, and 1st Runnerup, The HOJGA \$750 Scholarships must be used for college - no exceptions - See Scholarship Awards Program). Three rotational trophies will also be presented to the overall points winners in the 16-18, 13-15, and 13-18 Girls age groups. These trophies will be replaced with a plaque to allow the golfers to remember their accomplishment throughout their lives. **Junior golfers must be present at the Year End Event to receive scholarships and awards.**

POINTS DISTRIBUTION

Points will be awarded on the position of finish in each of the tournaments played and distributed in the following manner:

1st place 20 points	6th place 9 points
2nd place 17 points	7th place 7 points
3rd place 15 points	8th place 5 points
4th place 13 points	9th place 3 points
5th place 11 points	10th place 1 point

In the event of ties, points for each position will be totaled and divided evenly between all participants with fractions being rounded to the nearest tenth of a point.

In the boys and girls divisions, points will be awarded on over all basis within divisions. Girls ages 13-15 and 16-18 groups will play in 1 division using the red tees. In boys and girls in 13-18 divisions, **all strokes must be counted-no double par scores.**

In the case of a tie for overall points, winners will be determined, using the following tiebreakers in order as listed:

- 1. Participate in every tournament
- 2. Stroke average per tournament
- 3. Head-to-head 18-hole play

STROKE AVERAGE TROPHIES

Three rotational trophies will be awarded in age groups 13-15, 16-18 and 13-18 Girls for those players with the lowest stroke average per tournament (best 5 tournament scores). In order to be eligible for this trophy, a player must have participated in five (5) tournaments. Replacement plaques will be awarded in return for the rotational trophies at next season's Awards Event.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS PROGRAM

This program approved by the U.S.G.A. on July 6, 1987, by the NCAA on June 24, 1987 and is in accordance with the OHSAA

Junior Golfers competing in the 16-18 age division <u>who have finished participation in five</u> <u>tournaments</u>, are eligible to earn scholarships by the following method.

Step One: Junior Golfers earning the recognition of H.O.J.G.A. "Player of the Year", as well as the runner-up to that accomplishment will qualify for first level consideration to receive a scholarship award.

Step Two: Upon graduation from high school the student shall satisfy the following criteria to be considered as the award recipient.

A. The Junior Golfer shall graduate with an academic average of "C" or better.

B. The Junior Golfer shall obtain the written recommendation of his/her high school athletic director confirming that consideration is appropriate on the basis that the candidate has satisfactorily performed his/her school affiliated responsibilities.

C. The Junior Golfer shall, in the evaluation of the H.O.J.G.A. Scholarship Committee, have conducted himself/herself in a manner consistent with the "Code of Conduct" of the Heart of Ohio Junior Golf Association.

This scholarship awards program shall be administered in accordance with the published NCAA guidelines and requirements.

SPORTSMANSHIP AWARDS

There will be plaques given in all age groups, 12 and under; 13-15; 16-18; and Girls.

HOJGA members will choose a junior golfer within his/her division whom they believe to have presented true sportsmanlike conduct throughout the current year and why.

Forms will be presented, collected, and counted by tournament officials. Forms for nomination must be received no later than the appointed date. Plaques presented to winners at Year End Event.

HOJGA ACCUMULATIVE POINT SCHOLARSHIP (16-18) - \$750

(Scholarship Begun 1991)

The junior golfers who obtains most points over a 3-year period (must play in three consecutive years). Guidelines:

A. 16-18 Age Division.

B. Must accumulate most tournament points over 3 years (consecutive) in

H.O.J.G.A. Program. Excludes the winners of Player of the Year and other affiliated scholarships.

C. Must compete in *five tournaments in current year.*

D. Example: 2022, 2023, 2024

NUCOR STEEL MARION MOST IMPROVED SCHOLARSHIP - \$500

(Scholarship Begun in 2010)

This Scholarship will be awarded to the individual golfer who obtains the most improved overall scoring average within the current year. Challenges Juniors to strive for "Continuous Improvement". Guidelines:

- A. 16-18 Age Division.
- B. Must compete in five tournaments in current year.
- C. Each qualifying junior's previous year's average will be compared to present year's average to find most improved winner.

K of C (Knights of Columbus) SPORTSMANSHIP SCHOLARSHIP - \$500

(Begun 2000; K of C Sponsored Since 2010)

This scholarship recipient will be chosen by nomination by HOJGA members within the 16–18 age division, who will choose a junior golfer whom he/she believes to have presented a true sportsmanlike conduct through the current year and why. Guidelines:

- A. Must compete in five tournaments in current year.
- B. Forms will be presented for vote, collected, and counted by tournament officials.
- C. Voting will occur on designated date only.

The Amy Wensinger Roberts Girl Player of the Year \$1000 HOJGA Girl 13-18 1st Runnerup \$750 Steve Mills Memorial 13-15 Player of the Year \$1000 HOJGA Boy 13-15 1st Runnerup \$750

These scholarships will be awarded to the individual golfers who obtain the most overall points and runners-up in current season. Guidelines:

A. Must compete in **five tournaments in current year.**

The David J. Wensinger 16-18 Player of the Year \$2500 The Ross Carley Memorial 16-18 1st Runner-up \$1700 The Wensinger Family 16-18 2nd Runner-up \$500 The HOJGA 16-18 3rd Runner-up \$500

These scholarships will be awarded to the individual golfers who obtain the most overall points and runners-up in current season. Guidelines:

A. Must compete in five tournaments in current year.

HOJGA GIRL SPORTSMANSHIP SCHOLARSHIP - \$500

(Begun 2023)

The scholarship recipient will be chosen by nomination by H.O.J.G.A. members within the 13-18 division, who will choose a junior golfer that she believes to have presented a true sportsmanlike conduct through the current year and why. Guidelines:

- A. Must have competed in **five tournaments in current year.**
- B. Forms will be presented for vote, collected, and counted by tournament officials.
- C. Voting will occur on designated date only.

MARION COUNTY YOUTH FOUNDATION M.E.R.I.T. SCHOLARSHIP - \$1000

(Begun 2013, MCYF Sponsored since 2015)

The H.O.J.G.A. Tournament Officials will choose a junior golfer who best represents the qualities of the M.E.R.I.T. award: **M**anners, **E**tiquette, **R**espect, **I**ntegrity, **T**rust. Guidelines:

A. 16-18 Age Division.

B. Must compete in five tournaments in current year.

CHARLES EMANS PATRIOT SCHOLARSHIP - \$500

(Begun 2018, Sponsored by Danielle Emans)

The HOJGA Tournament Officials will choose a junior golfer who best represents qualities of Altruism, Attitude, Intregrity, Public-Spirited – all attributes of Patriot Emans. Guidelines:

- A. 16-18 Age Division
- B. Must compete in five tournaments in current year.

ROGER LEE HENSEL MEMORIAL LEGACY SCHOLARSHIP - \$500

(Begun 2023 Sponsored by Memorial Funds)

The HOJGA Tournament Officials will choose a junior golfer who shares the passion of golf, who aspires toward the golf profession, its discipline, integrity, and dedication just as entrepreneur Hensel was an aspiration to others. Guidelines:

A. 16-18 Age Division

B. Must have competed in *five tournaments in current year.*

DR. JERRY WENSINGER TWO-UNDER PAR CHALLENGE - \$500

(Begun 2022)

Instituted by Dr. Wensinger for **any** player who achieves two-under par, **two or more times**, during the current season. Guidelines:

A. 16-18 Boys', 13-15 Boys' and 13-18 Girls' Age Divisions

B. Must have competed in *five tournaments in current year.*

TOURNAMENT GUIDELINES

All tournaments conducted by the Heart of Ohio Junior Golf Association will have the following guidelines:

Age Brackets (As of September first of the current year) & Scoring Guidelines

*9-12 year old division (9 Holes) 8 year olds must qualify (see below); 13-15 and 16-18 year old division (18 Holes). Juniors age 13-18 should regularly score lower than 120 and Juniors 12 & Under, 63 or lower for 9 holes prior to signing up to play in tournaments.

<u>Girls</u>: The girls will play in the 13-18 Girls Division, using the red tees.

<u>Soft spikes</u>: All players must wear soft spike golf shoes or tennis shoes only.

<u>12 and Under Division</u> will be limited to 10 strokes per hole during tournament play. <u>Number of Entries</u>: All tournaments are limited to 120 entries.

<u>Entry Deadlines</u>: All entries must be received 10 days prior to tournament. All tournament entries must accompany blanket entry form.

<u>Tee Times</u>: Tee Times will be posted on the Web site <u>www.hojga.org</u>. They can also be obtained by calling 1-740-389-6207. <u>All players are to report no less than one half hour prior to</u> <u>their tee time.</u>

<u>Rules</u>: USGA, local Golf Course rules, and those of the Heart of Ohio Junior Golf Association "Code of Conduct" will apply to all events.

<u>Withdrawal</u>: No junior may be excused or leave tournament site unless authorized to do so by the tournament director/officials; hence a withdrawal without a permission slip means disqualification (and no refund) of junior's next tournament's entry. **Withdrawal will be permitted for illness only**, and a doctor's excuse must be received within 2 days to validate next tournament entry. A player who finishes a tournament may request that his score not be published.

<u>Rain</u>: In the event of rain, information pertaining to rain date will be available at the tournament site. Check media or call tournament site.

<u>Cancellation</u>: In the event someone must cancel, they must advise tournament committee <u>one</u> <u>week in</u> <u>advance</u> of the tournament to be considered for a refund of entry fee.

<u>Awards</u>: Ribbons and trophies will be presented at each tournament.

CLUBS FOR KIDS PROGRAM

This effort is aimed at making used (but still serviceable) clubs available to children who have a desire to learn and to play golf, but cannot afford the equipment. Clubs for Kids is designed to put a club in the hands of the children. As you may know, children who walk away from an instruction clinic with a golf club of their own are much more likely to use it for playing either in the backyard or on the golf range for playing and to solidify their interest in the game.

The program's context is to encourage golfers to donate their used clubs (& bags) and receive a tax credit entirely acceptable to the IRS, for the appraised value. Not only this, but they will be helping a needy and worthy child obtain equipment. The donated clubs are shortened, registered and distributed by the Heart of Ohio Junior Golf Association Program.

The clubs will be given to the child at the beginning of each season and registered in their name at a cost of \$2.00. At the Awards Banquet the clubs are to be returned. The \$2.00 is returned to the child upon return of the clubs in good condition. If the child cannot afford this fee, it may be waived at the discretion of the Association.

The main objective, again, is to get a club in the hands of the youth of the Heart of Ohio area who are interested in learning to play golf. .. a game for life.
